"CrimeFighter Corvette Requested for 55th Presidential Inaugural"

The 55th Presidential Inaugural Committee (PIC) led by Galen B. Jackman, Major General, USA, Commander, Joint Task Force, Armed Forces Inaugural Committee invited Captain Joe Jakub and the CrimeFighter Corvette to represent the state of Kentucky in the Inaugural Parade on Thursday, January 20th, 2005 for President George W. Bush. This is the second time they were invited to participate in an Inaugural Parade. It also appeared four years ago on January 20th, 2001 at George W.'s first Inauguration and was the only car in the parade other than the Presidential limousines. Former President George Bush Senior, First Lady Laura Bush, and President George W.
